I found some ideas that are easy, uses things around the house and are cute and fun. Let me know if you are interested, I can email or mail you directions!


LOOKING FOR SOMETHING TO LAUGH AT:

AVOIDING COVID-19 SCAMS

Scammers have no shame and nothing is off limit to them. They are experts in changing their tactics and hoping to catch people off guard. During this time of social distancing, people spend more time on their phones and computers for shopping and entertainment. Scammers may use your extra screen time and time at home as an opportunity to take advantage. Protect yourself by being aware of the different types of scams.

- Medicare Scams offering "COVID-19", "Coronavirus package" or Medicare benefits related to the virus.
- Shopping Scams creating fake stores, websites, social media account and email addresses claiming to sell items on high demand. They will keep your money but not provide the merchandise.
- Phishing Scams send false communications from what appears to be a trustworthy source to try to convince you to share sensitive data such as passwords and credit card information.
- Malware Scams can gain access to your computer system without you knowing. It can be activated when you click on email attachments or install risky software.
- App Scams mobile apps designed to track the spread of COVID-19 and insert malware into the app , which will compromise user's devices and personal information

Do not respond to calls or texts from unknown numbers or any others that appear suspicious. Never share your personal or financial information via email, text messages or over the phone. Be cautious if you are being pressured to share any information or payment immediately. Remember government agencies will never call to ask you personal information or money.
